Living as a Gift of Love

When Jesus was asked, "What is the greatest commandment?" He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it, You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37–39). This is what God has created us to do: to love Him and one another.

- We work together to do chores that are needed to meet our family's daily needs.

In our families, God has given us to one another to share His love. Each of us, then, was created to spend our lives being a gift of love for others.
