Focus 1: Jesus perfectly fulfilled the prophecies and the laws given by God to Moses. “For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ” (John 1:17). According to this Scripture verse, why weren’t the people of the Old Testament able to fully follow God’s laws given to them by Moses?

Focus 2: The Did You Know states, “In the Creed, we profess that Jesus is ‘consubstantial’ with the Father. This means that He is one in being, or of the same substance, as the Father. We profess that Jesus is fully God just as the Father is fully God.” When you say the Nicene Creed at Mass, what are you saying about Jesus when you say He is consubstantial with the Father?
