Lesson Enhancement Video: Called to Be Holy

- Start with personal experience: Have you ever had a friend do something that was hurtful? (Answers may vary.)
 - What did he do? (Answers may vary.)
 - Did his bad action harm your friendship or someone else's friendship with him? (Answers may vary.)
- Highlight the teaching point of the video: When we sin, we are like the friend who did something hurtful. Does God
 want to be our friend? (Yes.)
 - When we sin, do we hurt our friendship with God? (Yes.)
 - What is sin? (A choice to turn away from God and disobey Him.) When we sin, we reject God and His plan of love.
 - Can we sin by accident? (No.)
 - What are the two main types of sin? (Mortal sin and venial sin.)
 - What do venial sins do? (They hurt our friendship with God.)
 - What do mortal sins do? (They destroy our friendship with God. We reject God entirely! Mortal sins take away grace, the life of God in our souls.)
 - What are the three conditions of mortal sin stated in the video? (To sin mortally, you must do something seriously wrong, you know it is seriously wrong, and you do it anyway.)
- End by providing hope: When your friend hurt you, did you forgive him when he said he was sorry? (Answers may vary.)
 - God will always forgive us if we say we are sorry. In which sacrament do we ask for God's forgiveness?
 (The Sacrament of Reconciliation.)
 - Why does God always forgive us? (Because He always loves us.)

Gabriel's Quest for Chapter 11: Better Late than Never

Lesson Link: God creates us with the ability to choose between right and wrong. We can make the choice to be a person of holy character (to be the person God wants us to be).

- Why did Gabriel hesitate to return the money? (Answers may vary.)
- Why is it sometimes hard to do the right thing? (Answers may include the wrong thing is attractive.)
- Does it count that Gabriel wanted to keep the money but handed it in anyway? (Answers may vary.)
- **Optional:** Have students use their journal pages to reflect on Question 2: **Why is it sometimes hard to do the right thing?** Journal pages are available on the catechist and student portals.
