# Grade 5 Reflection Question

The Old Testament foreshadowed, or prepared us for, God’s work in Jesus Christ to conquer sin and death. Certain images, people, places, events, and objects from the Old Testament point to Jesus Christ. They especially give us a better understanding of His work in the sacraments. What is a foreshadowing from the Old Testament that helped you understand better a sacrament’s meaning and effects?

Answers may include the following:

• The Flood, the Red Sea, the waters of Marah, and the Jordan River show us that God uses water to destroy sin and evil, and this is what is destroyed in Baptism. He makes the waters of Baptism life-giving and salvific, and they make it possible to enter Heaven.

• The manna, altar of sacrifice, tabernacle, and bread of the Presence point to the Eucharist. Jesus is the true Bread from Heaven and offers Himself as a sacrifice on the altar during Mass. We consume the Eucharist just like the bread of Presence was consumed.

• The memorial of the Passover foreshadowed Jesus’ one perfect sacrifice and His new memorial of the Eucharist. As a memorial, the sacrifice of the Eucharist at Mass makes the events of His Paschal Mystery present to us.

• The paschal lambs foreshadowed Jesus, the Lamb of God. This means that the Eucharist at Mass is a sacrifice, and through it we pass over from death to life.
