Putting up Christmas decorations and keeping them up from December 24 through at least the Christmas octave is another beautiful reminder.

Above all, we must conform ourselves to Christ's example. In giving of ourselves, our time, and our treasure during Christmas, we are reminded of Christ giving Himself for our salvation.
