Lesson 1: Read Jeremiah 29:11–14. “I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you. You will seek me and find me; when you seek me with all your heart, I will be found by you, says the LORD.” How does this Bible passage strengthen you in hope?

Answers may include this verse helps me know that God does not leave me; instead, He has plans for me to be truly happy now and perfectly happy in Heaven. When I seek God, I will find Him.

Lesson 2: We all have a desire to know the truth. Why can God alone fulfill your desire to know the truth?
