- Hope makes it possible to trust in God's plan for my life. Because I have hope, I trust that God will answer my prayers, give me the grace to live as a child of God, and lead me to Heaven.
- Charity makes it possible for me to love God above all else and love others for the sake of God. Because I have charity, I give God my time for prayer each day, I go to Mass, and I choose to be kind and loving to those around me.
