Chapter Summary

After God's Chosen People made it to the Promised Land, they were surrounded by nations who had a king as a ruler. They, too, wanted a king, so God made Saul a king. King Saul was the first king of the Kingdom of Israel, and the Chosen People were called Israelites. During Saul's reign, a young shepherd boy who loved and trusted God won a battle against a Philistine giant, Goliath. David shows us that if we trust in God, God will always provide. After Saul died, David became king. God promised David that the Savior would come through David's family and his kingdom would last forever. Through Jesus, the Kingdom of God will last forever.

More for Parents

King David teaches us a comforting truth: God can work with imperfect people! David sometimes made mistakes—big ones. But he truly loved God and wanted to be a good leader for God's people. He admitted his mistakes and asked God for forgiveness. As parents, we make mistakes too as we are trying to lead our family—our own little domestic kingdom. David teaches us that God is not thwarted by people who make mistakes. Do we love God? Do we try to pray and lead our children to know and love God? Then we should not let our mistakes discourage us. We can follow David's example: admit our faults, ask for forgiveness, and receive God's mercy. In our families, we can do what David did for his people: teach our children to pray, teach them about God's mercy, and bring the love and joy of God into everything we do.
