## **Chapter 6**

## Lesson Enhancement Video: Sacrifice Is an Act of Love

- Start with the teaching point of the video: What sacrifice did Jesus make for us? (He died on the Cross so that we could have a new life of grace.)
  - · Before Jesus' perfect sacrifice, who else offered sacrifices to God? (God's Chosen People, the Israelites.)
  - What does it mean to sacrifice something? (To offer or give something up for the sake of someone else. It is an act
    of love.)
- Engage with the examples offered in the video: **Do we need to make sacrifices today?** (Yes.)
  - Do they have to be as big as the Crucifixion? (Of course not.)
  - In the video, we saw the boy make many sacrifices out of love. **Can you name some?** (Answers may include he ate food he did not like, helped his mom and dad, and cleaned up a mess his sibling made.)
  - What was your response to the boy's sacrifices? (Pause.) Are these things that you can do? (Answers may vary.)
- Make the video more personal: It is not always easy to make sacrifices, but what are some ways you can make
  a sacrifice of love? (Answers may include examples similar to what the boy was doing in the video. They also may
  include other things like helping pick up a sibling's toys and holding a door for someone.)
  - Why should we make these sacrifices? (To show our love for God and others.)
  - When these sacrifices are hard to do, what can we do so that we have the strength to do them? (Ask God for His grace and love to strengthen our love to make these sacrifices.)

## Gabriel's Quest for Chapter 6: Surprises

**Lesson Link: Students will become more familiar with the narrative of the parting of the Red Sea.** God will keep His promises.

- Can you name some people who were on the good side of God's surprises? (Answers may include Abraham, Moses, and the Israelites.)
- Why were they on the good side of the surprises? (They trusted God.)
- How can we be on the good side of God's surprises? (Answers may include by trusting God and following His commands.)
- Optional: Have students use their journal pages to reflect on Question 3: How can we be on the good side of God's surprises? Journal pages are available on the teacher and student portals.
