Promises

Lesson Link: God gave His Chosen People clues to remind them about His promises to send a Savior. These promises and reminders are in the Bible.

"Something special is going to happen before the end of the day," Sister Teresa told the class one morning.

The students looked at one another. There was whispering all over the room. *What was the surprise?*

In the middle of the morning, Mr. Norm arrived. "It's show-and-tell," he said happily. He pushed in a green lawn mower.

Mr. Norm showed the class how a lawn mower engine works. "The starter cord turns a flying wheel and rotates a crankshaft, and a piston moves in and out of a cylinder," he explained. "Fuel and air mix together to trigger the spark plug. The spark plug keeps the blade spinning." He finished by telling them how engines make cars and trucks work, and farm equipment that harvests crops we use for food.

Questions:

1. **How were the clues (lawn mower, cacao bean, and fire) connected to the cupcakes?** *(The lawn mower has an engine like that used to harvest wheat, which is ground into flour. Cacao beans make the chocolate that is in the cupcakes. Fire, or heat, bakes the batter.)*
2. It wasn't easy for the class to put the clues together and guess the surprise. **What did they have to do when they couldn't figure it out?** *(Trust in their teacher.)*
3. **Can you think of some of the clues and reminders that God gives in the Bible to remind us of His love and promises?** *(Answers may include God's promise to Adam and Eve, His rescue of Noah and his family, the promise He made to Abraham, the sacrifice of Isaac, rescuing His people from Egypt, and David's kingdom.)*
4. God promised to give us a way to be holy again. It took a long time for the promise to be fulfilled. **How did God keep His promise?** *(By sending His Son, Jesus.)*
