Chapter Summary

Adam and Eve were created in friendship with God.

Adam and Eve's sin had consequences for themselves as well as the whole human family.
Each human person inherits Original Sin and the consequences of sin. In our fallen state, we experience suffering, death, and an inclination to sin. God promised to send us a Savior to save us from sin and to restore and strengthen our relationship with God and one another.

More for Parents

Virtue in the Family

Keeping Our Promises

- Prayer activity:
 - God promises to be with us always. We should also spend time with Him in prayer for a few minutes every day.
 - Every day this week, spend time in prayer as a family, telling God you love Him, praising God for His goodness and power, telling Him you are sorry for your sins, and thanking Him for His grace needed to live a virtuous life.
 - End each time in prayer by praying Psalm 9:1–2 together.
- Practice remaining faithful to one another in your family.
