	The growth of the kingdom in the world is often hidden but
	significant.

5.	The Hidden Treasure (Mt 13:44)
	Answers may include the kingdom is found by those who are
	looking and the kingdom is worth everything.
6.	The Pearl of Great Price (Mt 13:45-46)
	Answers may include the kingdom is found by those with
	discernment and the kingdom is worth everything.
7.	The Dragnet (Mt 13:47-50)
	The kingdom will contain a mix of good and bad (righteous and
	unrighteous) until the final judgment.
