Part 1: Fill in the blanks. Use the words in the word bank. (Not all words will be used.)

1. The **canon** is the Church's official list of books in the Bible.
2. The word "**Christ**" is the Greek word for "Messiah" and means "anointed one."
3. **Salvation history** is God's master plan to save us from sin and unite the Church to himself in love.
4. Jesus saves us from the powers of sin and death through the **Paschal Mystery**, which is his Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension.
5. The Gospel of Matthew concludes with Jesus sending his Apostles to make disciples of all nations. This is called the **Great Commission**.
6. **Typology** is when words and deeds in Scripture foreshadow the fulfillment of God's saving plan in Jesus.
7. Through the prophet Jeremiah, the Lord promised he would one day make a new **covenant** with his people.
8. The **New Law** that Jesus gives is the grace of the Holy Spirit given to us through faith and the sacraments.
9. The proclamation of Jesus and the Good News through one's words and way of life is called **evangelization**.
10. The name **Emmanuel** means "God with us."
